God Directs Our Paths For His Glory

"O Lord, you have sent this storm upon him for your own good reasons." Jonah 1:14b (NLT)



Our youngest daughter has taken her first teaching position. Watching her experience these first weeks has reminded me of how many challenges and obstacles come along with any new job or adventure. All of us who have started a new job or new experience face a steep learning curve as we embark on a new challenge.

New ventures always come with hurdles and frustrations. Of all of the frustrations – the one that I always dislike the most – is that there are so many things that no one can really explain to us. On any task there are those things that we just have to experience for ourselves. We simply must trust that as we go, we will learn.

As we continue our series from the book of Jonah, the one sentence that continues to press on me is at the end of verse 14 of chapter 1. The verse reads:

"O Lord, you have sent this storm upon him for your own good reasons." (NLT)

This scripture plainly lets the reader know that God allows and brings things into our lives for His own Glory. This should not surprise us. After all, He is GOD! God is able to see the entire picture when we cannot. The story of Jonah is a picture of what can happen to Christ followers who hold on to parts of our lives that God wants to use for His glory.

Just like our minds are not able to comprehend all of the components of a new job, our minds and hearts are not capable of seeing the whole picture that God has for our lives. My daughter, Mallory, will have to just walk forward step by step each day as she experiences her first year of teaching. She will need to trust herself and lean on her education, but more importantly she will have to trust that as she experiences the unknown, her steps and direction will be revealed. The more she trusts those with experience and those who have the whole picture, the better she will become. Our walk with God is no different. We must not be anxious because He is orchestrating it all for His Glory.

Quaker Beliefs, Part 3

What do YOU believe about the Holy Spirit?

Introduction – In the past few months we have been reviewing early Quaker belief statements. Although many of us are familiar with these and accept them as truth, there are many in our world today who do not. In Second Timothy 4:2 we are told to "be ready in and out of season to explain and preach the Word." So far we have reviewed the Triune God, who was, is, and always will be. We have looked at our belief that Jesus Christ is both fully God and fully human. This month we want to look at the Quaker statement regarding the third person of the Trinity, the Holy Spirit. Here are excerpts from the Quaker statement, supporting scripture, and a short explanation.

Quaker Belief Statement about the Holy Spirit -

We believe that the Holy Spirit is, in the unity of the eternal Godhead, <u>one with the Father and with the Son. He is the comforter</u>." He convinces the world of sin, of righteousness, and of judgment. <u>He testifies of and glorifies Jesus. He quickens them that are dead in trespasses and sins and opens the inward eye to behold the Lamb of God that taketh away the sin of the world.</u>

Dwelling in the hearts of believers, <u>He opens their understanding that they may understand the Scriptures</u>, and becomes, to the humbled and <u>surrendered heart</u>, the Guide, Comforter, Support, and Sanctifier.

We believe that the essential qualification for the Lord's service is bestowed upon His children through the reception and baptism of the Holy Ghost. This Holy Spirit is the seal of reconciliation to the believer in Jesus, 8 the witness to his adoption into the family of the redeemed; the foretaste of the full communion and perfect joy which are reserved for them that endure unto the end.

Summary of Belief Statement – We believe that the Holy Spirit is the third person of the Trinity. The Holy Spirit works to pull us to a relationship with Christ by convicting us of sin, helping us understand God's scripture and God's ways. We believe the Holy Spirit intercedes for us and comforts us in our relationship with God. We believe the Holy Spirit brings us to God, cleanses us, keeps us, and works through us in service to God's kingdom. Quakers referrer to this entire process as "the baptism of the Holy Spirit."
