Red Hot Faith



Over the past three months, as we followed the earliest Christians through the book of Acts, we could see the RED HOT FAITH that they had. We witnessed the mighty power of the Holy Spirit in the lives of both individuals and the early church. Early converts placed their faith in the Son of God and continued a life of sacrificial living as they spread the gospel worldwide. As we transition from the early church in Acts and apply those lessons to Spiceland Friends, we see the need to keep our faith ignited and RED HOT.

We end the month of April by completing our focus on 1 Peter, chapter 1. Peter has encouraged us to view our Christian Faith in a day-to-day way. Peter encourages his readers to anchor back to the resurrection for their faith and then tells us how to live out our Christian Faith practically. While Peter encourages us to consider heaven, he inspires us to know that it is now, not

later, that we should live out our Christian Faith in a way that deepens our connection and the connection of others to the risen savior Jesus Christ.

As we lean into the month of May, I want you to become even more practical and consider one small daily habit that can move your faith toward the RED HOT zone. This may look different for each of us. For some, it might be a habit of prayer, the practice of simplicity, or a time of solitude. For others, it may be spending time in confession, worship, or service and love toward others. I pray that both as individuals and as a congregation, God works mightily through each of us in a way that inspires us to grow RED HOT in our faith walk. May we grow in Him as individuals and as a congregation for His glory.

The Spice Bush

I chose this timeless poem by **Ruth Pohlenz** from 1973 in a book commemorating the Sesquicentennial of our Spiceland Friends Meeting (1824-1974) because the words Ruth wrote were just as appropriate on the very first day our Quakers gathered under the trees to hear Calvin Wasson preach along Buck Creek in 1824 as they are today in 2024. As we celebrate our next milestone, our 200th Year Anniversary in September, I wanted to share this beautiful poem as a reminder of not only our deep roots but also our unwavering faith over the years.

The Spice Bush

From the eastern states to Indiana they came, Founded a town, then sought a name. For the honor of namesake, they chose not an oak But a humble spice bush, befitting Quaker folk.

The spice bush didn't stand tall and proud
And make a great display in a bid for fame,
But just quietly shared its fragrance
Giving Spiceland its name.
It lifted its leafy branches up to God,
Silently giving thanks for rain, sun and sod.
In ways it resembled the Quaker settlers no doubt,
For the spice of their faith, seasoned the
community about.

They lived their lives simply in the honest Quaker way,

Giving Spiceland a quality of life still evident today.

The Christian quality which has marked our town
