Blossoming Whether You Are Seen or Not

"Then their eyes were opened and they recognized him . . ." Luke 24:31

This past Sunday the scripture passage was John 9 – the story of the man born blind and the account of Jesus healing him. The story included an investigation by the religious leaders, an interrogation of the man's parents, and a second encounter between the man and Jesus. The man was healed by Jesus, and he could see for the first time in his life. Imagine how he must have felt as he saw people's faces that he knew, but had never seen, and as he saw trees, flowers, and buildings. These things had been there all the time, but he had never seen them. The conversation quickly moved to a deeper level as Jesus talked to the religious leaders about their spiritual blindness and why they could not understand. Then Jesus found the man and talked to him about seeing the Messiah and believing on him. The man said, "Show me" and Jesus said, "He is standing right in front of you." Jesus helped the man to see both physically and spiritually.

In the context of that scripture, I told about a house in our neighborhood that is in foreclosure and has been vacant for over a year. The yard is a mess – no leaves raked last fall, no fallen sticks and branches picked up, and no tender, loving care of any kind. It makes you want to look the other way when you go by. However, this past week I looked over at the yard and under a big tree, surrounded by weeds and grass, were two big patches of beautiful daffodils in full bloom. For the most part, no one saw them, no one was cutting them and taking them in the house for a bouquet, no one was enjoying their beauty, but they were still blooming. Amazing that something so beautiful could be hidden by something so ugly that it would be easy not to see the beautiful daffodils.

John's gospel is filled with stories that show us how to see God's work more clearly, how to see spiritually, and how to recognize God's grace and love in the most unexpected places. Stories like turning the water into wine, Nicodemus and his questions, the woman at the well, and this man born blind – these all illustrate and highlight the hidden and plenteous grace of God. Grace is something we don't deserve, but it is given freely. Our job is to open our eyes and see it working in our life and in the world around us. Sometimes, the problems in our life or in the world become overwhelming and, like the foreclosed house, they overshadow and hide the beauty of God's grace.

This month includes our Easter celebration, and we continue asking Jesus to help us see his work more clearly and to help us to do the work to which he has called us. Join us each Sunday with an open mind and listening heart as we join the early disciples in seeing Jesus more clearly.

New Grief Support Group Begins April 27

A new GriefShare grief support group will be starting on Thursday evenings beginning <u>April 27</u>. The class will offer support and encouragement after the death of a spouse, child, parent, family member, or friend.

The class will provide a warm, caring environment, and includes three parts – encouraging, information-packed videos, small

group discussion about the weekly video content, and a workbook for your personal use that includes additional information on each week's theme, scripture readings, and questions to reflect on that week.



Some of the topics included are: Is this normal? The challenges of grief. The journey of grief. Grief and your relationships. Why? Guilt and anger. Complicating Factors. What do I live for now?

You are welcome to begin attending our GriefShare group at any point. Each session is "self-contained," and you can pick up missed sessions later.

The class is led by **Janet Putnam** and **Cathy Harris** – and assisted by **Lisa Knotts**. The group will meet 6:30-8:00 p.m. in the Mary M. Room. The class meets for 13 weeks and will go through July 27 (no meeting on June 22 during VBS).

The class is free and open to anyone who is grieving the loss of a loved one. He is risen!

W. E. Sangster (1900-1960), a well-known pastor in England, contracted a progressive, incurable muscle disease. He lost the ability to move his legs, and eventually his voice faded away. Because Sangster wanted to continue serving God even though he could no longer preach, he became a prolific writer and organized prayer cells throughout England.

On Easter morning, shortly before his death, he wrote a note to his daughter in an unsteady hand. "It is terrible to wake up on Easter morning and have no voice to shout, 'He is risen!'" he wrote. "But it would be still more terrible to have a voice and not want to shout."
