



"In him was life, and that life was the light of all mankind." John 1:4 (NIV)

We are working to understand how we can step back, listen to God, and let him take the lead. Jesus continues to be the life and light of all mankind. Jesus continues to live that life and light through us as we allow it. Jesus continues to guide us through each step of our life and to strengthen us for the storms.

Come to worship each Sunday in July. Celebrate that we can be back together in person and celebrate this life of Jesus in each one of us.
