"Rejoice in the Lord"

"Yet I will rejoice in the Lord! I will be joyful in the God of my salvation!" Habakkuk 3:18 (NLT)

(Note – This article is a reprint of my Newsletter article from June 2022.)

The verse printed above is the concluding prayer of the prophet Habakkuk as he concludes his short book. After questioning God about the circumstances of his world and why God is letting that happen, Habakkuk comes to this conclusion: "Yet, I will rejoice in the Lord." He had questioned God about why there is so much violence; why is there so much greed; why is there so much immorality; why are there so many atrocities; and why is there so much rejection of God's ways? He had begged God to intervene. He kept asking God how long he was waiting to fix the problems. God gave Habakkuk several answers, but the most important one was that "the just (or righteous) shall live by faith."

The questions and the answers in this ancient book are not just for the nation of Israel in 600 BC. They are questions that we ask today – over and over again. The answer is the same for us. We come to the conclusion that God is in

control and that he really is acting in our time and that he is working things out according to his purposes. The command to us is also to live by faith that God has worked in our lives and in the world in the past. We take the time to recount how God has crossed paths with us and how he has guided certain circumstances in our lives. We read the Bible and see how God has worked in history in miraculous and amazing ways. As we review the past, we gain confidence that we can walk by faith – live our lives believing that God loves us and is walking with us in our journey of life.

We come to worship each Sunday to lay our questions and concerns before God, to be reminded of his word to us in the Bible, and to marvel at his majesty. This will allow him to refresh us and to empower us to truly "be joyful in the God of our salvation." Despite everything going on in our lives and in the world today, worship allows us to see that God is working and he has not forgotten us,

Beyond Belief to an Apprenticeship

As we continue to move through the Gospel of Mark, we are becoming increasingly aware of the priority Christ Followers should have. Mark simply shows us the acts of Jesus and invites you and me to be his apprentice.

As Christ Followers the church isn't just a place we go; it's who we are. As the body of Christ, we're called to live out His heart daily through four essential priorities: bringing others to Christ, growing through discipleship, encouraging the hurting, and serving with love.

Bringing others to Christ is our first calling. Jesus said, "Go and make disciples of all nations" (Matthew 28:19). Every soul matters to God. Sharing the gospel is about offering the same grace and freedom we've received. "How will they believe in Him of whom they have not heard?" (Romans 10:14). Evangelism isn't pressure, it's an invitation to hope.

Discipleship is how we grow. Jesus didn't just call believers, He called followers (apprentices) (Luke 9:23). Discipleship means learning to live like Him, in community, through Scripture study, prayer, and accountability. "As iron sharpens iron, so one person sharpens another" (Proverbs 27:17). A discipled church is a strong church.

Encouragement during hardship reflects Christ's compassion. Life brings grief, illness, and doubt. The church is called to "bear one another's burdens" (Galatians 6:2) and to "encourage one another and build each other up" (1 Thessalonians 5:11). In a world full of noise and pain, encouragement is a quiet force of grace.

Serving others is love in action. Jesus said, "The Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve" (Mark 10:45). We reflect His heart when we feed the hungry, care for the lonely, and meet needs with humility. "Faith without works is dead" (James 2:17).

When you and I, our meeting, and the whole church body lives out these four priorities, it becomes a beacon of light, hope, and healing to our world. This is not just our mission, it's our identity. And every apprentice of Christ has a part to play.
