"Shipwrecked"

About 15 years ago, Tom and Chris went on a fishing and bear hunting trip to Canada. Both of them went fishing, and although Chris went out with Tom to go bear hunting, he wasn't actually hunting himself. They had a great time and came back and told me lots of stories about being up there. I told them if they went back the next year, I might go with them and I could go on walks and sit outside or go swimming. Tom laughed and said I would only be able to walk a few feet from the cabin because of the bears nearby, and that if I sat outside, I would have to wear a full "bug suit" - head to toe, and that I could swim if I wanted, but the water was freezing cold. I decided I'd just let them go back and I'd do something else! I told Tom before he left to take care of himself and watch out for Chris while he was hunting. Tom replied that all Chris had to do was to run faster than him and Chris would be fine.

One day they went out fishing with two other boats – the other boats had eight French-men. It looked like a nice day. They got out on the lake, and a bad storm came up suddenly – pouring down rain with lots of lightning and thunder. The Frenchmen motioned for Tom and Chris to follow them. They did not want to stay out on the lake in that bad storm. So Tom and Chris followed them.

The Frenchmen headed up to the shore, tied up and secured all three boats, and then they went

up to a cabin and knocked on the door. No answer. So the Frenchmen opened the door – and Chris and Tom followed – and they all took shelter inside the front porch of a stranger's cabin. Chris and Tom discovered that up there – no one locked their cabin – or at least leaves their closed in porch unlocked – in case someone has an emergency and needs to take shelter – even if you weren't home. Chris thought that was really cool. They waited in that porch until the storm ended and then headed back out.

Storms bring with them different feelings in us and in others around us – fear for some of us, and some people – like Tom – are intrigued by storms. There have been several times when there were tornado warnings advising people to take cover, and the kids and I were hunkered down in the bathroom with pillows and the dog and cats, while Tom was standing out on the front porch watching. He likes storms. I don't.

This year's vacation Bible school theme is "Shipwrecked" – and the kids will be talking about some of the storms and Bible stories that take place on the sea – as well as shipwrecks. The kids will have great adventures on the high seas that week!

Sometimes our lives feel like we are being tossed around in the storms of life when we are faced with illness, conflict in relationships, problems at work, the loss of a loved one, or financial difficulties.

Unexpected problems come into our lives each and every day. When storms blow into our life bringing changes, we have a choice – we can fight it, we can resent the storm or get bitter about it – or we can learn to adapt. Sometimes we simply cannot navigate around a storm.

Whatever the storm, we can cast out four anchors:

- 1. Know that God is with you you're not alone.
- 2. Remember who you are you're God's! and God loves you!
- Stay connected with God's people our church family!
- 4. Count on God's promises you'll make it through.

That's what the kids will be learning – that God is with us – rescues us – and will see us through life's storms.

Tom, Chris, and Meredith went up to Canada the next year for a fishing trip, and they had a great time – bug suits, bears, and all! Me? I stayed home and kept the home fires burning and curled up with a good book.

News and Notes from the Missions Committee



Spiceland Friends Church has been very busy supporting the local community. We raised \$576.01 for the Baby Bottle

Boomerang. We also provided an evening meal for the local chapter of Brianna's Hope. Brianna's Hope is a substance abuse group in New Castle working to provide hope and support to people struggling with alcohol and drug abuse. We gave Henry County Special Olympics \$150 in memory of David Moffitt. We continue to provide yummy desserts once a month to The Guest House, the local men's shelter in New Castle. We provided lodging for a local couple and their two children who had their utilities unexpectedly shut off during the Memorial Day weekend.

All of the people above were extremely appreciative of our help.

We will be hosting a Pancake Breakfast on July 14 during Spiceland Freedom Days. There will be a sign-up sheet for cooks and servers.

We are also considering a possible missions trip to the Mesquakie Friends Center later this summer. Possible dates are August 10-16 which would provide an opportunity to experience the Mesquakie annual Pow Wow on August 11, when non-Native Americans are allowed to participate. Cost would be between \$250-300 per person and would include all meals and lodging. We would be staying in the director's home – sleeping in beds and with air-conditioning. There is some indoor and some outdoor work that needs to be done. The Center is located in Tama, Iowa. Are you interested in going? The Missions Committee needs to know what kind of interest there is.
