"The People God Chooses"

"How thankful I am to Christ Jesus our Lord for choosing me as one of his messengers, and giving me the strength to be faithful to him." 1 Timothy 1:12 (TLB)



When I was in school, recess or lunch hour was a time that the boys would choose teams and play a game. Two people would be designated as captains and then they would take turns picking someone from the group to play on their team. Of course, the most athletic and coordinated boys were chosen first. I always dreaded these games because I would always be chosen last or next to last because I lacked athletic ability, and they had seen the way I played in previous games. One captain would say to the other one: "You take Brock." The other captain would say: "No, I had him yesterday – you take him." I couldn't blame them. They were playing to win, and they needed the best team members possible.

Adult life is much the same way – employers are looking for the best team members for their business so they can be profitable and successful. Students with the best grades get admitted to the best colleges and then they get the best jobs when they graduate. All of this picking and choosing makes us strive to be the best in whatever we do and to improve our skills and abilities.

Sometimes, we fall into the trap of believing that God does the same thing - chooses only the best for his calling and work. However, the Bible and our life experiences do not show that this is the case. Instead, God seems to call flawed and imperfect people for his work in the world. The scripture quoted above is the introduction to a few verses where Paul writes to Timothy that God does just the opposite of what we would expect. Paul uses himself as an example and discusses how he was chief among sinners: "Even though I used to scoff at the name of Christ. I hunted down his people, harming them in every way I could. But God had mercy on me because I didn't know what I was doing, for I didn't know Christ at that time." (1 Timothy 1:13) God chose Paul while he was still a sinner and the most unlikely candidate for God's work, but God transformed him and made him into a follower of Jesus who would do great things to spread the good news of Jesus. Paul put it this way in verse 14: "Oh, how kind our Lord was, for he showed me how to trust him and become full of the love of Christ Jesus." We have seen the same principles at work in the book of Esther as God (Continued on back)

chose two of the most unlikely people to save his people from extermination.

God chooses each of us – weaknesses and all – to do his work in the world. The most amazing thing is that he promises to give us the ability and strength to do that work. The story of Esther has taught us to "cling to hope, however small, and to confidence that whatever evil might currently reign, the story of God isn't finished." (Mike Cosper in *Faith Among the Faithless*). God is faithful to us no matter what our situation is or the circumstances we face. He promises to draw near to us and to love us as he forgives us and strengthens us.

Have You Ever Been Really Disappointed?

The first birthday I really remember was when I turned seven. I was getting ready for school when I decided to snoop around for a few minutes to see if I could find my present. Sure enough, as I rounded the corner to my mom's side of the bed, laying there in plain sight was a blue "Tonka" truck. But WAIT!! It was not the REAL one I had begged for. . . It was a plastic imitation. My heart fell. Disappointment began to weigh down my excitement. Not only was I not getting the truck I had dreamed of. . . I began to realize that it was only early morning and I had already discovered what would be the pinnacle of the day. Not only was it the wrong gift. . . . I had nothing else to look forward to for the rest of my birthday.

Life never goes the way we expect. We are faced with EXTREME disappointment. A job loss, a family issue, a marriage struggle, a housing situation, a career goal, and even a life-threatening disease, or the death of a loved one CRUSHES us with disappointment. How we react and handle these moments is defining. We can choose to grow bitter and push back or we can choose to continue to grow through the heartache. I want to give you some quick steps that the Bible reveals to us on how to best handle CRUSHING DISAPPOINTMENT.

We must keep believing in God! God is a miracle worker. We worship a God who parts water, moves boulders, heals the sick, and raises the dead. He is able to save our very souls. We do not know if God will remove our problem or disappointing struggle, but we can trust and believe that from his perspective He knows best what we need for our future in both the now and eternity. *"My thoughts are nothing like your thoughts," says the Lord, "and my ways are far beyond anything you could imagine. For just as the heavens are higher than the earth, so my ways are higher than* the earth, so my ways are higher than your ways and my thoughts higher than your thoughts." – Isaiah 55:8-9

It's OK to grieve! Things have not gone the way you wanted. Your hopes and expectations have been defeated. You need to spend some time being sad, mourning the way you thought things would be. It's ok. *"The Lord is near to the brokenhearted and saves the crushed in spirit."* –*Psalm 34:18*

It's time to pray and talk with God. *"Give your burdens to the Lord, and he will take care of you. He will not permit the godly to slip and fall. – Psalm 55:22*

Be thankful! "Sing and make music from your heart to the Lord, always giving thanks to God the Father for everything, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ." – Ephesians 5:19b-20

Believe in yourself! With God's help you have the tools to conquer *those who trust in the Lord will find new strength. They will soar high on wings like eagles. They will run and not grow weary. They will walk and not faint. – Isaiah 40:28-31*

We can get past our crushing disappointment. It's a step-by-step process. Give it to God. He will help you heal as you walk through this part of your life. There will be new life through our trials. New life now – New life in eternity.
