"Draw Nigh to God"

"Draw nigh to God, and he will draw nigh to you." James 4:8a (KJV)

Last Sunday we talked about the scripture verse above and tied it into the story of Jesus healing a man by the Pool of Bethesda (John 5). This man had been unable to walk for 38 years and had been reduced to begging from people passing by. Jesus told him to get up, take his mat and walk. He was instantly healed. However, he did not move toward Jesus and try to find out more about him. Instead, he moved away from him and tried to distance himself from Jesus - even offering to turn him in to the religious leaders who were upset that Jesus healed him on the Sabbath.

We would probably never be that ungrateful, but we do allow many barriers to block our movement toward Jesus. It could be packed schedules, feelings of unworthiness, uncertainty if Jesus will accept us, or unwillingness to follow his leading. In the remaining four weeks leading up to Easter, we are going to explore several themes from the Bible that will lead us closer to Jesus and his example and teaching.

The passage from James above has two parts. First, a command – we should try to draw

nigh to God. Second, a promise - God will draw nigh to us. This promise that God will move toward us is throughout the scripture. God's reaching for us is not dependent on our actions, but our actions can enhance that movement and relationship. Two people who fall in love suddenly want to be together all the time, they begin to think of ways to please the other person and think of things to do that will bring them closer to each other. The same is true of our relationship with Jesus. He wants our love for him to be great enough that we work to spend more time with him (listening and studying). He wants us to find ways to do his work (helping others in a variety of ways). Moving toward Jesus is not always doing "religious" things. Many times, it involves a transformation of our attitude, a helping spirit, or an encouraging personality.

Let's work on moving toward God and watch as he moves toward us.

Joni Eareckson Tada knows what it's like to wrestle with this issue – in her own life as well as when she sat by her father while he was dying. Behind every right-to-die situation is a family like yours – longing for hope, answers, and a release from suffering.

Comforting and Surprising Look at Death & Dying. The author, Joni Eareckson Tada, shares her own journey of choosing life-giving alternatives to assisted suicide. She also shares stories of others who

have wrestled with the heartache of end-of-life questions. The book provides encouragement and compassion to help make the difficult decisions with the hope of a caring, loving God.

The study begins Wednesday, <u>March 7</u>. We will have a pitch-in dinner (main course, drink, and table service provided) at 6:00 p.m. with the study taking place from 6:45-7:45 p.m. The study will last four weeks and go through <u>March 28</u> (Wednesday evenings).

Missions & Evangelism Committee Report

The Missions and Evangelism Committee met on January 31. 2018. It was agreed that **Nancy Wadman** would be the Clerk for the 2018 year. We are excited about the possibilities for both financial support and outreach activities for our community. We will be promoting Baby Bottle Boomerang for Henry County Pregnancy Care Center through March 18. The bottles are currently available in the Welcome Center. This money is used to give local women hope and help when often they feel they have no choice. The Center provides pregnancy tests, confidential counseling, community referrals and information on options. They also help with baby food and material needs.

We also took desserts to the men at The Guest House for Valentine's Day. We would like to make this a monthly activity. The Guest House is the local men's shelter. They don't usually have enough money in their budget to provide desserts for the men on a regular basis. We thought it would be a nice treat for us to take dessert to them once a month. If you would like to help, there will be a sign-up sheet on the table in the Welcome Center. March 15 is the next opportunity for us to be a blessing to someone less fortunate. They usually have between 20 and 25 men staying at The Guest House so we will need 3-4 people to provide a dessert each time. Please put it in a container that you don't need returned. Cookies, cakes, pies, brownies – anything your family would eat for dessert will be greatly appreciated.

We have been informed of the passing of **William Robertson** on January 25. He was the son of the late Dr. Robertson, well-known physician here in Spiceland.

Boiler Replacement Update

At a special Called Monthly Business Meeting, we approved the recommendation from the Trustees to replace our boiler (50 years old and in very poor condition). The boiler heats the water to provide hot water heat to all of the original building. The building addition completed in 2006 has a separate forced air heating system. The total cost to replace our boiler with two high efficiency boilers is \$24,400, and includes parts, labor, as well as dismantling and cleanup of the old boiler.

Our goal is to raise the whole amount of \$24,400 so that the General Fund will not have to be impacted by this capital expense. In a wonderful unexpected expression of generosity and commitment, we have received a total of \$19,250 to date. We would like to raise the additional \$5,150 by March 7, 2018, and we are asking for your help to finish the job. Checks may be made payable to Spiceland Friends Church and marked -"New Heating System" or "Boiler." They can be mailed to the church, put in the offering, handed to Tom Pyle, Assistant Treasurer, or dropped off at the church. You also can contribute online through our website and either mark it for the "Heating System" or let us know that is how you want it designated.

I am constantly amazed by the deep commitment of our congregation and the deep commitment to God's work through Spiceland Friends. I am certain that each one of us will consider what we can do to help with this need and then follow through as God leads us. It continues to be a wonderful experiment in faith.

If you have any questions, you can direct them to Cathy Harris or me. Also, Tom Harris, Clerk of the Trustees, and any other Trustee member can answer questions about the boiler and scope of the work.
