"Rejoice in the Lord Always!"

"Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice!" Philippians 4:4 (NIV)



We have been studying the book of Philippians the last couple of months on Sunday mornings. This month we will conclude that study as we consider the last chapter. We started this year with this study because Philippians is a book about Joy. As we began 2021, we all thought we needed some joy in our lives since 2020 had been a year filled with setbacks, lockdowns, political turmoil, and racial demonstrations.

Our theme for this month is **"Rejoice in the** Lord Always" and it is taken from Philippians 4:4. Note that in this verse Paul says to rejoice twice in the same verse. He also says to rejoice in chapter 3, verse 1. For him to repeat this statement over and over, it must have been an important principle that he wanted us to apply to our lives as we grow in Christ.

Paul is not suggesting that we attend a seminar on positive thinking or that we force our-

selves to think positive thoughts. He is suggesting that we can rejoice in all things because our lives are grounded in Christ and he is dwelling inside of us. It is because of the work that Jesus has done in our lives that enables us to rejoice in all circumstances. It is our deeply held conviction that Jesus is in charge and that he is strengthening us. He will be present in our lives no matter what.

One of the ways that followers of Christ learn to rejoice always is by being in a community of believers who encourage each other. Scripture admonishes us to gather together to worship God and to encourage one another on a regular basis.

Our goal as we gather to worship in these weeks leading up to Easter Sunday on April 4th is have everyone come back to in-person worship services. Many people have received their second vaccination shot, and we continue to practice recommended safe habits (masks, social distance, hand sanitizer, etc.) We will all be enriched by seeing each other in person and being able to laugh together, pray together, and celebrate God's grace in our lives together. We will continue to broadcast our services via Facebook Live for people who are out of town or unable to attend for other reasons, but we want to have a big Easter celebration with most of our congregation attending in person. Pick a couple of Sundays between now and Easter to come in person and check it out and then plan to be present on Easter Sunday at our Early Service (8:00 a.m.) and/or at our Easter Celebration Worship at 10:30. Let's come together and rejoice in what the Lord has done in our lives and in our community.

Please Watch Your Step

Playing a child's game of tag in the cover of night is a dream. of night is a dream come true for every 16 year old boy. My confidence had grown throughout the night as I was able to out maneuver and out distance my neighborhood friends. It grew, that is, until I received a SURPRISE that has remained with me to this very day. While racing confidently through the dark as fast as possible, I had decided it would add an element of excitement to the game if I ran backwards when suddenly I ran surprisingly into a hole. It was not just any hole. It was deep - customized to fit my speeding, arrogant foot perfectly. The surprise step into that hole not only did enough damage to my knee to change the next 12 weeks of my life, it altered the course of my physical activity to this very day. The repair and replacement of my entire knee as a 16 year old has continued to impact my daily life today as a 55 year old. This was a surprise that has rippled through my life for nearly four decades. Sometimes surprises enter our lives that create ripples that last a lifetime.

We never know what hole we will step in. It could be a heart attack or the death of a child or spouse. It could be a surprise job loss or a divorce. It could be a financial strain or just the stress of day to day living. We just don't know where the hole will be, how deep it will be, or when we will step in it. We never know if the hole will be one we dig ourselves or a hole that someone else digs for us. All we know is that there will be surprise holes at some point. All we know is that when we are falling in, we have an advocate, a friend, a counselor, a physician who will catch us at some point during our fall. We know that Jesus is perfect in his reaction to our step in the hole. He may alert us to a hole that is near and approaching or he may allow us to step in so blindly and aggressively that we experience a life altering fracture. Either way, he is present to catch us or lift us up from the bottom. He loves us with an everlasting love! In Deuteronomy 31:6 we read: "Be strong, do not panic before them. For the Lord will personally go ahead of you. He will neither fail you nor abandon you."

Often, when we are surprised, we are disoriented and flooded with emotions; even panic and anxiety fill our minds. When surprises strike,

we must remind ourselves that Christ is present. His presence can calm us. His presence can catch our fall. His presence can heal the wounds of the fall when we've crashed to the bottom. His presence can lift us back out of the hole. His presence can save us in every sense of the word.



"Snowball" played for Spiceland Academy from about 1895 until 1903. Then he played for
