God's Plans Are the Best!

"For I know the plans I have for you," declares the Lord, "plans to prosper you and not harm you, plans to give you hope and a future." Jeremiah 29:11

I don't know about you but I tend to drag my feet when someone asks me to do something new. I never quite feel like I am qualified or will be good enough for what they want done. When Lisa asked me to come volunteer at the prison, I couldn't begin to imagine that I could relate to these men that have totally different backgrounds and have committed crimes I would never think of doing. Well, God had other plans in mind for me. You have heard this story before, so I will go on.

The Ministry and Oversight Committee asked me if I would be willing to help out at church for awhile until we can find an Associate Pastor to work with David. Once again, I am thinking that there is no way that I am gualified, but again God had another plan in mind. I have to admit that God's plans are always better for me than I can ever imagine. Jeremiah 29:11 says, "For I know the plans I have for you," declares the Lord, "plans to prosper you and not harm you, plans to give you hope and a future." I find amazing comfort in this verse, especially now with the Covid-19 situation we are dealing with. Trusting God should come naturally, but I have to work on it every day, by praying, reading scripture, talking and sharing with people. My heart knows but my mind is sometimes slow to follow!

As I have been reading the Bible during this difficult time, I came across Psalm 96 in my Life Application Study Bible. This version is so upbeat and brought me such comfort that I wanted to share it with you:

Psalm 96

Sing a new song to the Lord!



Let the whole earth sing to the Lord! Sing to the Lord: bless his name.

Each day proclaim the good news that he saves. Publish his glorious deeds among the nations.

Tell everyone about the amazing things he does.

Great is the Lord! He is most worthy of praise! He is to be revered above all the gods.

The gods of other nations are merely idols, But the Lord has made the heavens! Honor and majesty surround him;

Strength and beauty are in his sanctuary. O nations of the world recognize the Lord;

Recognize that the Lord is glorious and strong. Give to the Lord the glory he deserves!

Bring your offering and come to worship him. Worship the Lord in all his holy splendor.

Let all the earth tremble before him. Tell all the nations that the Lord is king.

The world is firmly established and cannot be shaken.

He will judge all peoples fairly.

Let the heavens be glad, and let the earth rejoice! Let the sea and everything in it shout his praise! Let the fields and the crops burst forth with joy! Let the trees of the forest rustle with praise before the Lord! For the Lord is coming!He is coming to judge the earth.He will judge the world with righteousness And all the nations with his truth.

The teacher in me wants to have you highlight the action verbs in this Psalm – words like sing, proclaim, publish, tell, recognize, worship, rejoice, shout, burst forth! Use this Psalm to help you to cope with this difficult time and Know that God is still in control! Use those actions to share with others how glorious God is and will always be, no matter what.

So make a plan, with God's help it will be perfect! Don't drag your feet like I do!

Sing every day even if God is the only one to hear you!

Proclaim to others what He is doing for you! **Publish** (write a note to someone) we all like to get mail.

Tell someone how much you love them or miss them!

Recognize all the big or little things God is doing for you each and every day.

Worship God in all you do.

Rejoice in His love for you!

Shout (well, don't scare people) his greatness to others.

Burst forth with phone calls, cards, treats, good deeds to help someone else!

You will be amazed at how much better you will feel with just sharing God's love.
